On Sunday, February 7 young people from all over the United States and Canada will be sponsoring in their local churches a very special opportunity for church members. Church members will have the opportunity to make Super Bowl Sunday not only a "Sports Day", but also a "day of caring and concern for those who are without even a bowl of soup to eat."

Souper Bowl Sunday was a program developed by an Associate Pastor of the Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, South Carolina in 1990. The Senior High Youth in his church contacted Columbia area churches with the idea of sponsoring a special collection of "Soup" and "Money" on Super Bowl Sunday in support of a charity of their choice. Souper Bowl Sunday went statewide in 1991, and in 1993 the first National Souper Bowl took place. Young people from all over our nation collected donations of soup and money to be used locally. All organizers requested was a report so that the aggregate each year could be determined.
